Izard County Fair General Rules and Regulations

- 1. All entries are made with the distinct understanding that the Izard County Fair Association is not responsible for any loss or damage which may occur to any animal, article, or person during the fair. Care will be used in handling livestock to prevent injury to man or beast, but the abovementioned organization and its board members or volunteers will not be responsible should an accident occurs.
- 2. All entries must be made in the name or names of owner or owners of animals and articles. See Livestock Rules for ownership dates.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are defined as those 19 years of age or younger, single, and never have been married. Exhibitors may not exhibit as a Junior after graduating from high school or earning a GED except for the fall following graduation.
- 4. Exhibitors must reside full or part time in Izard County or attend a school in Izard County or be a member of an Extension Homemakers Club, Master Gardeners, 4-H club or FFA chapter in Izard County. Junior exhibitors must be a member of a 4-H or FFA chapter and be under the supervision of a 4-H or FFA advisor. Exhibitors who are not old enough to be in 4-H or FFA, and 3 years of age can show under supervision of their parent/guardian.
- 5. Exhibitors may show in only one county fair junior show in Arkansas.
- 6. The Izard County Fair board of directors reserves the right to withhold premium money, Purple Circle money, and/or awards if exhibitors do not abide by this rule.
- 7. Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission Health Regulations are listed in the Livestock Rules. A health inspector will be present to check health papers at check-in. No horses will be allowed on the fairgrounds unless an EIA Tester is present to check Coggins papers. Check the schedule for times to check in horses. All poultry exhibits except ducks must be tested and found to be Pullorum-Typhoid free. Birds will be tested free-of-charge at the front gate of the fairgrounds between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on check-in day.
- 8. All disputes and misunderstandings shall be settled by the chairman of the department in which they occur or by the Izard County Fair Board.
- 9. Judging of all exhibits will be by competent judges in their respective departments. No person who is a relative of any exhibitor will be allowed to judge their entry.
- 10. Premiums will be paid on a point basis. The value of the points will be determined by the number of entries. Premiums will be paid from the records from each department. Exhibits removed before a department's official check-out time for that department will forfeit all premium money. The judges' decision will be final. All premium checks should be cashed before December 31, of the fair year, or they will be void.
